The coordinator of the research project does **not** endorse or reprove the use of any of these products and resources; it is up to each individual homeschool family to determine which materials - in any category - it should use.

Similarly, though I endeavor to be as accurate as possible, it is incumbent upon each family to do its own research because it's possible that the positions of some of these entities may change over time.

That said, if he feels at some point in the future that changes in college entrance exams are such that exposure to the CCS might be necessary for student mastery of the exams, he might publish a supplementary guide to help his advanced students apply the CCS vernacular within the Classic Science curriculum. But he has no immediate plans to do that.
